Opening Committee Report

With a change in the COVID 19 --Provincial Restrictions, it was decided that we should open the sanctuary for Worship effective July 18, 2021. With all the previous protocols still in place (from the fall of 2020) the same procedures were used to ensure the safety of those who chose to attend worship. People pre registered, maintained social distancing, sanitized hands, wore a mask — those protocols were restored as well as being ushered to a reserved seat. There was no singing however we did reinstate the lay reader who does the announcements and reads the scripture.

Again, those attending indicated they were thrilled to be present in the sanctuary for worship. Some others indicated they still very much miss the singing. Some have indicated they still feel safer at home using the live streaming service or viewing on YOU-TUBE at their leisure. Still others indicate they will be attending in person in the fall.

We continue to monitor the rules and restrictions from the Provincial Government/the Southwestern Ontario Public Health officials and the United Church of Canada for changes or new concepts. As a result of the lessening of some restrictions effective September 1, we will be allowing bookings for the Friendship Room, the Banquet Hall and the Multipurpose Room. Several Celebration of Life Services and a wedding have been approved and will take place during the fall. Protocols have been updated for those areas and a contract and booking must be completed at the office. It is very important for all to be safe while at the same time being compliant with all the restrictions that are necessary. Each room has a maximum number of persons who may be in the room and that will need to be enforced. Things are returning to a "new normal."

The use of the kitchens and serving food continues to be monitored regularly in consultation with a rep from the Southwestern Ontario Public Health – Inspector. Each request requires consultation before a decision is made. There are a lot of factors involved in those decisions.

Stay tuned. We continue to monitor and update as the restrictions change; it is important to be compliant and safe at all times. Remember to social distance and wear a mask. We have had discussions about the vaccination needles but to date there has been no decision. Will vaccine shots be mandatory for those attending worship/events at St. Paul's? That discussion /decision may be re-visited as we move into the fall.
