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## Update from Southwestern Ontario Public Health

On Tuesday, the church office received a memo for the SW Public Health explaining the "Reinstating Capacity Limits" effective December 2-January 10, 2022. This memo was specifically titled Weddings, Funerals and Religious services and indicated that the capacity limits at these services be limited to 50%. Therefore, in summary we have been compliant and will remain complaint with no changes necessary. We will continue to maintain social distancing and MASKS MUST BE WORN.

Even as we finalize plans for our Christmas Eve Service, we will be compliant with the suggested number of 70 -75 max.

Stay tuned for details about pre-registering for the Christmas Eve Service. Those details will be announced in about 2 weeks. Thanks. Mary Anne.
