Foodbank Drive - July

Compared to this time last year, the need has grown sharply:

• In June 2023, we had provided 1,810 services—this year, we've already delivered 2,225, a 23% increase.



- By the end of June 2023, we had welcomed 122 new clients. This year, that number is already at 162, a 33% rise.
- •So far in 2025, we've distributed a staggering 105,683 lbs of food. For context, our total for the entire last year was 140,000 lbs—we're already at 75% of last year's total, and it's only June.

These numbers speak clearly: more individuals and families in our community are facing food insecurity—and turning to us for help.
